Dear Fathers, Brothers and Sisters,

Greetings from Bishop's House, Balasore!

This circular comes to you in the context of the celebration of the feasts of two most beloved saints of the Church – St. Therese of Lisieux (the 'Little Flower') and St. Francis of Assisi (the 'Poor One').

The Little Flower, who never left the four walls of her convent and yet is considered the Patroness of the Missions, is a great model for each one of us. She supported the missionaries in their life and work of evangelization by means of her prayers and penance. Imitating her we could also offer our support and encouragement to those of us engaged in one good activity or another for the good of the Mission, especially those activities we ourselves are not capable of or are not directly engaged in. Besides, more than ever, all of us in our mission need her intercession these days. Let us make ourselves worthy of it.

Kneeling before the tomb of St. Francis in the crypt of the Basilica at Assisi on the 14th of September, I overheard a prayer made by an elderly woman who was at my side. Among the many things she was telling to the Saint, I remember one which got my attention: 'Francisco (Francis), help my family'. Apart from the fact that the Italians and many devotees of St. Francis of Assisi would like to address him Informally as 'Francisco', as if he were one member of the family, he is also informed of day to day happenings and problems in life and simply asked to intervene if necessary. The simple and direct prayer of the woman to St. Francis inspired me to pray for our diocese at that moment. Interestingly, a woman of faith from probably a middle class Italian Catholic family was unknowingly teaching a bishop kneeling by her side to say: 'Francis, help my diocese'.

What was the problem with her family for which the woman needed Francis' intervention? Poverty? She would not ask the 'Poor One' of Assisi to help her in her financial difficulties. Lack of peace? Loss of job? A wayward son or daughter? An unfaithful husband? The list could be long. In my case, after having met with different funding agencies of our Diocese in Germany, and made a cordial relationship with them, I was not going to ask St. Francis to get us some financial aid. Rather, I was having in my mind and on my lips the prayer we all in the diocese have – to give us peace and experience of solidarity in these days. We do really need these and St. Francis is really capable of helping us. Let us ask his intercession.

1. THE NEW BISHOPS' MEETING IN ROME

I had the opportunity to participate in the seminar for the 'New Bishops from the Mission Territories', organized by the Vatican's Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples' (Propaganda Fide) from the 7th till 20th of September. We were about 96 new bishops, 15 of whom were from India. The seminar was an enriching experience for all of us and very informative. Heads of various Congregations in the Vatican Curia were the resource persons.

A tour to Assisi with a Mass at the Basilica of St. Francis was part of the programme. But the high point of the whole seminar was the audience with the Holy Father in which he addressed us, and the chance each of us had to meet him and interact with him. That programme was held at the Vatican and with it the seminar was fittingly concluded.

While I was in Europe I had also the opportunity to the meet with the friends and benefactors of the Diocese. On the whole, my trip was a fruitful one, thanks to the prayers of each one of you.

2. ANNUAL RETREAT FOR THE PRIESTS OF THE DIOCESE

As has been announced earlier, the Annual Retreat for the Priests of the Diocese will held from the 13the till the 17th of this month, in the premises of the Bandel Shrine in Kolkata. Fr. Basil Thottankara, C.M., well known for his pioneering missionary activities in the North East, has kindly consented to be the preacher. All the priests of the Diocese are obliged to attend the retreat. Please take it as an opportunity that is provided to us for our own self-spiritual renewal, as well as for rekindling missionary spirit during this Jubilee year.

3. THE SEMINAR FOR THE RELIGIOUS OF THE DIOCESE (POST-PONED)

4. RETREATS IN THE PARISHES

A Charismatic retreat will be conducted at Hatigarh for the Santal speaking Catholics of the diocese from the 2nd till 5th of October. The retreat will commence on the evening of 2nd October and conclude on the 5th noon.

Retreats in Odiya language will be held in the parishes of Balasore and K.C. Pur in the coming months. The dates will be announced shortly.

7. MISSION SUNDAY 2014

I urge all the parish priests and heads of the institutions to exhort those in their care to contribute more, making use of more creative and innovative ways to raise funds for the missions. Let there be a significant increment this year in the contribution we make to the support the missionary activities around the world.

The parish priests should ensure that the **liturgy of the Mission Sunday** be celebrated in a meaningful and fitting manner to suit the occasion.
